**New Beginnings** - We are now well into the first stage of the New Beginnings process for congregational renewal. We have sent our Assessor, the Rev. Mark Lewis, various pieces of information about our congregation; and, this Wednesday evening (the 30th), Mark will conduct an **Assessment Visit** with us. This will consist of a meeting (by Zoom) with John Zondag at 6:00, followed by a **separate meeting with as many people in the congregation as possible**, from 7:00 to 8:00 (also by Zoom), to learn more about our congregation. The link to the Zoom meeting will be e-mailed out early in the week.

**Please plan to take part in this meeting!** If you don't have access to the internet, perhaps you could arrange to use the computer, i-Pad, or smartphone of a family member. It's unfortunate that we can't have Mark visit with us in person, but, since he lives in southern Ontario, it's not practical to have him come to Portage la Prairie under current conditions.

On the basis of the information he receives, Mark will write an **Assessment Report**, which will form the basis for a congregation-wide discussion of future possibilities for our congregation — which is the next stage in the New Beginnings process.

**Assistant Coordinator** - At the recommendation of the Soup Kitchen Committee, the Session has appointed **Gloria Nichols** Assistant Coordinator of the Soup Kitchen. Gloria is a recently retired nurse who worked in Saskatchewan for many years, and moved back to Portage la Prairie after she retired. We welcome Gloria to the Soup Kitchen team!

**Presbyterians Sharing** - Today is "Presbyterians Sharing Sunday", so designated by the General Assembly of our church. Since we're not meeting in person this week, we can't give out the usual brochure. Givings to *Presbyterians Sharing* from congregations across the country support the mission and ministry of our national church. At our Annual Meeting in February, we accepted an allocation of (made a commitment to contribute) \$3,200. As of the end of August, \$2,800 has been given to P.S., which means that we're only \$400 short of our goal! **Many thanks** to all who contribute to Presbyterians Sharing throughout the year!
