Hanging of the Greens - Today's service is our annual "Hanging of the Greens" service, which we had to cancel last year, since we were not able to have services in person at the time. This service explores the significance of many of our Christmas and pre-Christmas traditions. However, today's service is an abbreviated version of what we've done in the past, since we've reduced the number of hymns, due to the pandemic. We are also keeping the amount of movement in the service to a minimum; so we will remain seated, and will not get up to decorate the Christmas tree, etc. We are reducing the number of readers to a minimum for the same reason; so the reading parts will be read by Lalaine and Ruth Buan, and John, only.

Year-end Report - FOCUS, the local ecumenical group that produces a crop in support of the **Canadian Foodgrains Bank** every year, reports that it had a successful growing project this year, in spite of the weather having been the driest in recent years. Their project raised \$194,537. Combined with a 4:1 matching grant from the federal government, the total amount raised will be \$972,685. FOCUS thanks everyone who supported this year's project. The name "FOCUS" is an acronym for "Feed Other Countries; Undo Starvation".

Vacuuming the Sanctuary - If you would like to take a turn vacuuming the sanctuary from time to time, please sign up on the sheet that's on the music stand at the back. Since we keep the sanctuary cool during the week, the easiest time to do the vacuuming is on Sundays, either before or after the service. Mission Moment

Supporting Vulnerable Children

Antony Misoya, a 15-year-old orphan from Mitumbira village in Malawi, is HIV positive. He attends a program managed by the Mulanje Mission Hospital where he receives care and support with his antiretroviral medication regimen. Staff began to notice Antony's visits to the program had become less frequent. When asked, Antony told them, "I go around looking for work to support my two brothers and sister; sometimes I miss my treatment because I am working." Program staff visited Antony and his guardian and discovered that it had become difficult for her to provide for all four children, so the team provided them with support that made it possible for Antony to attend the clinic regularly and focus on his studies. This project that provides care and support to orphans and vulnerable children in Malawi is supported by *Presbyterian World Service & Development*.

Attendance Limit - The latest public health orders (effective 13 November) limit attendance at our services to <u>25 people</u>, period. Our highest attendance so far this fall has been 22 (including the pianist and the minister), but our average attendances have been lower than that, so we're all right for now.

Protocols - In order to protect each other from transmission of the COVID-19 virus, please follow these protocols in our Sunday services, until further notice:

- Wear a mask. Those participating in leading the service may remove their masks when they are speaking, so that they may be more easily understood.
- Maintain physical distance (2 meters) from others (except members of your own household).
- Use hand sanitizer when entering the sanctuary.
- An offering plate has been set out at the back of the sanctuary.
- Remain seated throughout the service, including for the hymns.
- Bring your own cushion and/or Bible each week, if desired.
- Prefer that washrooms not be used.
- There will be no coffee/fellowship hour.
- Refrain from shaking hands, etc.
- The names of attenders will be recorded each Sunday, so that we have a record of who attended on which Sunday, in case contract tracing should need to be done later.
