- Day-to-day:

- Sunday mornings:
  - Unlocking the doors and turning the lights and sound system on before the service; turning the lights and sound system off and locking the sanctuary doors after the service *Margaret McN-R*
  - Locking the outside doors, and setting the alarm on Sundays, following Coffee Time *People hosting coffee time*
- Other:
  - Writing material for the quarterly Newsletter, and e-mailing it to Lisa
  - Sending the Newsletter out by e-mail Lisa

It is of variable length, comprising four to eight Sundays, depending on whether Easter Sunday is "early" or "late". This year, it includes seven Sundays, since Easter is relatively late. The final Sunday of the season is Transfiguration Sunday, which, this year, falls in February. The seasonal color is green.
