Mission Moment

For 33-year-old Sigere Medison, a single mother in the Balaka District in Malawi, life took a harsh turn when an El Niño weather phenomenon affected her community. "El Niño left a devastating impact on our lives. We used to eat only once a day and sometimes we would go to bed without food. Being a mother of four, with two children under the age of five, it wasn't easy for me," Sigere shares. Relief came when *Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D)* and Canadian Foodgrains Bank implemented an emergency response with the help of local partner CARD. Sigere received monthly cash transfers for five months. "Since November, life has been smooth. My family has been able to eat throughout the day. I am forever grateful," Sigere shares with a smile.

The Christian Year - Although Thanksgiving Day (which dates back to colonial times) is a well-established festival here in North America, it is a relative "newcomer" to the Christian Year (which gradually took shape centuries earlier, during the Middle Ages). In the Christian Year, Thanksgiving Day is somewhat of a secondary festival, since it has to do with something other than an event in the life of Jesus, or in the history of the church. Nevertheless, it is an important festival, since it affirms that God, as Creator, provides the food we need. On Thanksgiving Day, we give God thanks and praise for the harvest, through which he replenishes our supply of food each year.

In Canada, Thanksgiving Day has been an official holiday since 1879, but has been observed on the second Monday of October only since 1957. In the United States, Thanksgiving falls on the fourth Thursday of November. The Sunday of the Thanksgiving weekend, previously called "Thanksgiving Sunday" in our church, was quietly renamed **Harvest Sunday** by our national church a few years ago, presumably to emphasize the fact that it's specifically the *harvest* that is the focus of the celebration.
